Theoretical Discussions on War in International Relations By Assoc. Prof. Dr. Haldun YALÇINKAYA

Since the end of the twentieth century, much of the debate about modern warfare has been about whether it should be described as 'old' or 'new'. However, there has not been a definitive answer as to which best reflects war in the modern world. Increasingly, the alternative arguments are polarized into opposing camps. Indeed, it would be fair to say that there is little in the way of debate at all. By revaluating the strengths and weaknesses of each argument, this conference aims to describe these two camps, namely "new war" and "old war" proponents. In fact, there is a middle way between these camps. In essence, I would argue a new approach is emerging as Critical Strategic Studies.

Haldun Yalçınkaya graduated from Kuleli Military High School and later Turkish Military Academy. During his military service as an officer, he completed his post-graduate studies in International Relations at İstanbul University. He studied "peacekeeping" at MA level and "transformation of war" at Ph.D. level. After earning his Ph.D. degree, he had academic studies at Oxford University, West Point Military Academy and the University of Florida. Furthermore, during his military service, he served in Afghanistan in 2005. He published two books on war issues and several academic articles. After serving more than ten years at Turkish Military Academy he has been Associate Professor in International Relations at TOBB University of Economics and Technology since 2013. As of now, Dr.Yalçınkaya has been conducting research on Foreign Fighters.
