The world and our broad neighbourhood are undergoing profound change and instability with ramifications on the global economy, international peace and security and international system. What is at stake for Turkey? How does Turkey respond to the new global and regional challenges and opportunities? SAPEM will ask Ambassador Assoc. Prof. Dr. Burak Akçapar, who in the last 30 years, has experienced two major global shifts (the end of the cold war and the post-2008 crisis) as a national diplomat, international organization officer, and academic.

Ambassador, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Akçapar is a career diplomat for three decades whose previous appointment was Ambassador Plenipotentiary and Extraordinary to the Republic of India, accredited simultaneously to Nepal, Maldives and Sri Lanka. Dr. Akçapar is also an Associate Professor of International Relations since 2011. He received his Dr.Iur/Ph.D at the University of Hamburg, School of Law II, with High Distinction. He is the author of three books; the most recent one was People's Mission to the Ottoman Empire (Oxford University Press, 2014). He wrote a monthly column on current affairs titled Theory and Practice in The Sunday Standard and The New Indian Express between 2015 and 2017. For his contributions to the practice of diplomacy he was awarded a Doctorate Honoris Causa in India.
