Abstract: CPD during COVID and beyond: challenges and opportunities

The onset of the global pandemic in 2020 has inevitably changed the world of education forever, and for most of us online and/or hybrid learning will be here to stay whether we like it or not. This talk will consider some of the major implications of this paradigm shift in terms of our own well-being as educators, and will look specifically at challenges and opportunities for CPD (Continuing Professional Development) in this changing world.

About the presenter

Dr. Simon Phipps is Director of ATI (Anatolia Training Institute) in Ankara, which provides teacher training and educational consultancy. He has been Principal Examiner for Delta Module 3 since 2008 and an External Examiner for Delta Module since 1997.

He previously worked as Deputy Director of Bilkent University School of English Language in Ankara for 20 years, where he was responsible for in-service teacher training and development. He designed and directed an in-house MA programme (Management in Education in ELT), and taught MA courses on linguistics, lexis and educational management. He has worked in ELT in the UK, Germany and Turkey since 1984, and has been involved in teacher education since 1989. He has a PhD in Education, from the University of Leeds, UK, with a focus on teacher beliefs. His current professional interests include teacher cognition, teacher learning, teacher education research, and educational management.

For students, he has co-authored *Evolve* - a new adult coursebook series for adults - and *Eyes Open/Uncover* for teenagers. His areas of interest include visual literacy and issues of identity and the language learner.

Abstract: Integrating Practicality in Online Education: Applications

Undoubtedly, online applications have become milestones of effective teaching during the COVID-19 pandemic, which has led alterations in many of service fields, including education. Even though the concept of online education was not a novelty in today's digitalized world, it had received limited attraction by some educators. However, the pandemic, lasting roughly one year, has made online teaching inevitable. In this respect, the debate about whether online education should be practiced or neglected is no-good. Instead, the debate ought to be related to how to increase the productivity and effectiveness of it. Therefore, there is a necessity to enhance learning through effective and practical applications, since the digital 'generation' that is grown up in the Information Age, learners tend to be having short attention span and consuming the given in a rapid manner. For responding to the expectations, various interactive applications are required to be utilized in online platforms. In this presentation, it is aimed at introducing a couple of web-based applications, namely ThingLink, Chegg, Socrative, Edmodo, and Scratch.

Abstract: Implementation of Self-Organized Learning Environments in Virtual Learning

Self-organized learning environment (SOLE) is a learning environment that raises students' motivation and self-confidence while providing them with a great deal of responsibility of their own learning. In SOLE, where students work collaboratively in groups, teacher poses a thought-provoking question and leaves them alone to find answers to this question using the Internet or other ways of doing research.

The aim of this presentation is to elaborate on self-organised learning environments as well as benefits and possible drawbacks of its implementation at the university level in a Turkish context. In this session, how SOLE has been adapted to online teaching and some sample student works will also be demonstrated. In this respect, we can question how SOLEs can be adapted to face to face learning considering social distancing while implementing protective measures of Covid 19. Although it has been implemented at university level, this session can also inspire young or teen learner groups as it can be adapted to their learning context.

About the presenter

Gözde Partal is an instructor of English who has been working at Antalya Bilim University for about 8 years. Throughout her teaching, she has worked with young learners, university students and adult learners. She graduated from American Studies Department, Dokuz Eylül University in 2011. Then she completed her Master's Degree in English Language Teaching Department at Akdeniz University. In her dissertation, she worked on motivational self-systems of Turkish and international English language learners. She is currently working on ways of increasing students' autonomy and self-confidence in online teaching with the integration of digital education tools.

Abstract: Integrating Technology into Online EFL Writing Classes

Even though the COVID- 19 pandemic forced institutions to move to emergency remote instruction abruptly, this pandemic was an opportunity to develop remote education strategies. Our experiences with online, blended, and flipped writing classroom practice provided us with an insight into the potential of implementing online teaching and learning in both virtual and physical learning environments. This presentation will cover how to integrate modern educational technology into writing instruction and the stages of process writing. We will also cover how to integrate technology into a traditional in-classroom setting effectively in L2 writing classes.

She completed her Bachelor's degree in English Language Teaching at Hacettepe University, and she is presently pursuing her master's degree in English Language Teaching at Anadolu University. Abstract: Assessment in Online Education

With all the threats and limitations brought by Covid-19, online education can embrace this change and transform pedagogy with the help of technology. One area which can immensely benefit from technology mediated instruction is assessment. A true redefinition of assessment in online education era can yield numerous advantages such as speed, accuracy, reliability, student engagement and many more. With a brief look at the existing theories about assessment and how it differs from traditional testing, the session will focus on some hands on techniques to carry out online assessment in language teaching.

About the presenter

As a former British Council Teacher Trainer in Middle East (2006-2010), with double Master's degrees in ELT and Information Communication Technology from Iran and Australia, in 2006 & 2012, respectively, Amir has been the founder, CEO and DoS of IZ Education Center in Iran since 2002.

His research interests lie in Linguistics, ELT, and Drama in Education. More precisely, he is interested in research where those different fields might work together or affect each other. He was employed by Monash University English Language Center, in Melbourne Australia as an ELICOS teacher in 2012 to teach general English, IELTS, Bridging courses and Academic English to International students at Monash University until 2016. Abstract: Practical and Effective Feedback in Online Setting

As a common practice of Professional Development (PD), peer-observation of teaching has always had an essential place in teachers' development. Teachers have long been relying on this form of PD for the purpose of exchanging ideas based on their classroom experiences and practices. Upon the outbreak of COVID-19, without a doubt, the transformation to online education brought many challenges for teachers, not sparing the opportunities in terms of teacher collaboration. This session will focus on the rich potential of peer-observation by highlighting its practicality in online settings by means of conducting activities free from time and place, still complying with the core steps of peer-observation. In other words, there is no need to arrange a suitable time-slot for both parties; teachers do not have to sit and observe a lesson for 45 minutes, nor do they have to arrange another suitable time-slot for a feedback session. In this regard, online peer-observation enables teachers to work in their own time and asynchronously.

The session will start with a discussion on how peer-observation has evolved in the online teaching period. The initial discussion session will help participants understand the rationale behind our approach in online peer-observation. Then, our online peer-observation experience will be presented through samples to show the effectiveness of such a practice, hoping to serve as a model for those who would like to benefit from a similar experience. It will finish with a question-answer session to discuss the effectiveness of the approach.

About the presenter

Nazan Gelbal is an EAP instructor at School of Languages at Sabanci University and I have been teaching English at tertiary level for ten years. My main interests include personal and professional development, online teaching and academic writing.

Abstract: “Another School is Possible” Education Approach and Implementations

The aim of this presentation is to provide information about the education approach and implementations created by Another School is Possible Association and shed light on the work carried out by S.S. Antalya Another School is Possible Education Cooperative (BBOM Antalya), which is in the works of founding a kindergarten and a primary school in Antalya. The BBOM education approach developed by the BBOM Association is based on four axes which are alternative education, unique financing, an ecological stance and democratic management. Setting out with the motto, “Each child is unique and has a right to shape the education process that is a part of his/her life,” BBOM schools adopt an education approach where children rights are emphasized and children can learn based on various learning methods, their interest areas and skills. BBOM schools, which are participatory and peaceful learning communities, are managed by children, families and the school staff in a democratic way through classroom and school councils. BBOM schools rely on the science of ecology that examines the relationship among all living things in the areas of food, cleaning, energy use, waste management and education. In this context, the architectural structure, dietary habits and all education activities are created based on an ecological perspective. BBOM schools, which were established through education cooperatives created under the initiative of parents, are private schools that are subordinate to the Ministry of National Education; however, they are not profit-oriented commercial enterprises. Annual business expenses are equally shared by parents who are partners in the cooperative and have their children registered in the schools. In addition, BBOM schools aim to have 20% of its students on scholarship in line with the principle of equal opportunity in education. There are kindergartens and primary schools that implement the BBOM education approach in İzmir, Ankara, Eskişehir and İstanbul. In Antalya, operations that started in 2013 have accelerated with the foundation of the cooperative in 2019 and renting of the school building in 2020. BBOM Antalya Education Cooperative is working towards opening the kindergarten in April and the primary school in September to unite children in Antalya with their schools where they will be very happy. After all, we know that, “A lost childhood cannot be compensated.”

About the presenter

Seda Eskidemir Meral, who completed her undergraduate education in the Department of Preschool Teacher Education at Marmara University in 2009, finished her master's program in the Department of Elementary Teacher Education at Akdeniz University, Institution of Educational Sciences in 2013. In the same year, she started her Doctorate Program of Preschool Teaching in the Institute of Educational Sciences at Gazi University, which still continues. She worked as a preschool teacher between 2009 and 2011, and as a research assistant at Akdeniz University between 2011 and 2013. She has been working as a lecturer in the Department of Child Development at the Vocational School of Health Services at Akdeniz University since 2014. Among her academic interest areas are preschool education programs, various approaches in preschool education, child-centered education and humor development in children.
