Course Objectives: To demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the basic theory of courtyard design
To realize socio-cultural and functional aspects of courtyards
To present design languages and landscape elements of courtyards
To enrich the basic knowledge of hardscape, softscape (plants) and furnishings for courtyard design

Course Description: This course incorporates landscape architecture, architecture and interior architecture. It discusses the importance of open spaces in buildings in general and courtyards in particular. It illustrates the typology and designing criteria for courtyards. The course also sheds light on the hardscape, softscape (plant identification and selection of plant materials), services and furnishings of courtyards in detail, focusing on the principles of interior design.
A variety of design examples and case studies around the world will be discussed according to the design principles and the representative meanings of courtyards.

Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of the course, students will

1. Be knowledgeable of the history, typology, characteristics, and function of courtyards.
2. Acquire courtyard design skills
3. Develop creative approaches for courtyards reflecting social conditions, common aesthetic perspective and cultural identity
4. Develop basic cognition of plant identification and planting design

Language: The lecture, discussions, presentations and assignments will be in English. Developing your verbal language skills will be very important in acquiring the disciplinary terminology as well as daily communication at the class.

**Planned Learning
Activities and Teaching
Method:**

Learning/Teaching Method: This is a lecture-based course in which students will learn courtyard design by getting involved in different actual and abstract case studies. The course will be supported by lectures and student presentations as well as individual reports.

Assignments: Assignments are in the form of presentations for different topics as well as an analyzing report of a given space in terms of courtyard design. Students are required to submit a final portfolio including all the presentations and the final reports in one file for the final evaluation of the course.

Class Participation: Regular attendance of all enrolled classes is expected. Do not be late for the class. Attendance will be taken through your signature within the first quarter of the class; if you come later you will be considered half-attended. At the end of the Semester, your attendance will be reported on the UBS. Attendance is compulsory and in case of absenteeism of more than 30%, the system will automatically grade you "FF". If you miss a class, it is your responsibility to 'make up' all work, including items discussed in class. The class contribution will be measured in terms of quality, not quantity. If you need to leave early, you should notify your professor at the commencement of the session.
