Course Objectives: Provide an understanding of the principles of interior design and shape a basic knowledge about

the professional practice with its relation to other design disciplines

Course Description: This course introduces a general perception related to the fundamentals of interior

architecture/design by focusing on different dimensions of the profession. By shifting from a macro scale to an interior space, interior architect candidates will learn professional terminologies. The aim of this course is to introduce students the fundamentals of interior

architecture.

- Understand the need for competence and skills to collaborate effectively across multiple disciplines when developing design solutions.

Method:

**Learning/Teaching Method:** The expected learning outcomes for the course will be assessed through: lectures, group presentations, a Midterm Project, Final Project and Class discussions and feedback.

**Assignments:** Students are required to do weekly research/reading and two presentations throughout the semester.
