- Develop and understanding of basic accounting terminology and procedures.
- Provide you with a basic understanding of the accounting cycle and the accounting system.
- Develop an understanding of how business organizations operate and the events, which have a financial impact upon them.
- Provide exposure, where appropriate, to international differences in published financial statements.
